BOARD BUSINESS and UPDATES

Recap of 2021 Annual Meeting Briar Creek I

hank you to all who attended our Annual Meeting on December 7, 2020. A great big thank you to all who submitted their Proxy in advance to ensure that our Annual Meeting could take place.

There were 196 proxy forms returned and here are the results. As to our funding of **Reserves**, full funding or less than full funding, 191 voted for less than full funding for 97.45%. For the **lower level of audit** versus the higher level of audit, 188 voted for the low level of audit for 95.92%. Please note that this does not mean we are not audited. Progressive Management must conduct the highest level of audit and we would just be paying for what has already been done.

As for the **proposal to amend the by-laws** to only allow individual(s) to purchase property in our community, 182 voted to limit purchases to individuals and not allow a corporation or LLC to purchase for 92.86%. For the **proposal to increase the late fee on monthly dues**, 183 voted for the increase to \$25.00 for 93.37%.

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BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Things do change regularly and so does your Board of Directors (BOD). Every year, three or four of the existing Board members must decide whether to remain for another term or step down and other owners/residents then join the board to replace them. This year has seen many changes with two of our original members resigning during their term. Gene Arend was appointed to fill the unexpired term of one member and the other position was left vacant for the owners to fill at the annual election. Ray Jablonski chose to step down as a director after many years of great service. Roy O'Neill chose to step down as he is 'stranded in Canada' due to Covid-19 restrictions. Connie Holmes chose to remain for another term. As there were no more than four candidates needed, all four were elected by acclamation.

Your new BOD is made up of Al Hartin, Pat Rivera, Connie Holmes, Gene Arend, Jeff Clark, Lynn Lijewski and Kim Stoltz. Jeff had previously been elected for a second term but resigned during that term. Lynn Lijewski is new to the Board but is not a new face to Briar Creek as she has been involved in many things throughout her years of ownership here. Kim Stoltz moved to Briar Creek over a year ago and chose to step up and work for her community.

Spanish Moss


ou probably know that the tangled, greenish-gray plant that hangs from tree branches is called Spanish moss. What you might not know is that it's an "air plant"—it absorbs water and minerals from the surroundings rather than

with roots. It's not native to Spain, and it's not a moss! It's related to the Bromeliads, a group that includes pineapples.

Spanish moss seeds are carried into trees by the wind, and sometimes pieces may be carried by birds. It does well on tree branches because it's closer to sunlight. Once established, it grows like any plant. Spanish moss doesn't hurt the tree it grows on, although a heavy growth might block sunlight from getting to leaves. It's often seen in sickly trees because there's more room to grow, not because it's made the tree sick. You know you're in the South when you see Spanish moss.
