Board immediate communication — Gene Arend

We have looked at the mybriarcreek.com email server and can see we only have 101 owners who have logged in and saved their email address. That means if an emergency or some form of urgent news needs to reach you 216 don't get the message.

While a water leak requiring us to turn off the water for a period of time may be the more common alert, we do sometimes need to send, on occasion, other important notifications you may want to know about immediately. Sorry but telephone calls do not work. Many do not answer their phones anyway. If we attempted to call those needing to get immediate information. To just call 60 people the timing is bad. The simple math is, it will take 5 minutes to dial the number, a few minutes to deliver the message, if you answer your phone or your voicemail is not full, a few minutes to answer your questions. Therefore, the simple math is 5 minutes to notify 60 units will take 300 minutes (5 Hours). The emergency is over.

Phone trees do not work, trying to get a phone captain for each street has not proven successful, plus if you don't answer or you are not home then someone doesn't get the message.

E-mail provides instant messages going out. Granted not everyone has email or you may not check it every day but if your water is off, you can find out who, what, where and when it's coming back. Plus, with most water outages, we can plan in advance so you will know in advance and plan accordingly.

The Board of directors realizes there are other e-mail messengers in the community however they are not always available. Their list may include others not in Briar Creek Phase I. At least one director is available and will have the ability to get the message out, if there is information the community needs to know immediately.

If you don't have e-mail then get to know your neighbor, they may have e-mail and they can alert you to something you need to know about right away. You may have received a message recently from the board. This was a test to ensure the email addresses we do have are valid. If you did not receive a message from briarcreekoff@gmail.com then we do not have your address on file.

More...Briar Creek Travel Club

Briar Creek travel club is a combined effort between the two phases of Briar Creek. If you don't have access to E-mail, the clubhouse Travel Bulletin Board is your next best means or a friend who has e-mail and is a member of the Travel Club. The Monthly Media is a wonderful form of media but it sometimes can be 30 or more days too late for some things. Any resident of Briar Creek, their family or friends can be a member. It's only through the many that we can get better travel services with group discounts and savings.

- 1. There are many ways to be a part of the travel adventures we plan each season. There is the clubhouse bulletin board where you can find flyers posted with information on the trips and signup sheets so you can join one of the trips.
- 2.There is a website <u>www.upcsportshub.com</u> with a page dedicated to our travel club. This contains the trip information and includes more details on some of the trips. There is also an automated sign-up form on the travel page so you can sign up for a trip, or send information needed for some travel trips.
- 3.We will, on some trips, use the services of a travel agency to assist us with our trips. Our Travel Agent is there to assist you also however it's important to note the travel club needs to get the sign-up information first. Our agent often times may be away escorting other trips. They also assist and service many other organizations and may not be familiar with you individually. The

Briar Creek Travel club uses the records we maintain on all trips to validate and confirm guests on our trips. Contacting the travel agency in advance could result in information being lost as we have no way to compare the trip manifest if you are not first listed on our manifest for the trip. Timing could be an issue if the agent is away from the office escorting another group.

Please contact the Briar Creek travel club first. Our Travel Agent can then contact you if any additional information is needed for the trip. For many trips, the Travel Club will maintain the funds until we know we have the minimum capacity necessary to meet the trip requirement. This makes it possible for the Travel Club to refund the trip cost to you if it's necessary to cancel a trip. Once we reach that threshold to pay for the trip, some trips may not be refundable but we can transfer the trip to another name as a replacement.
